<b>The exam is 25% Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing.</b>	See the full AQA GCSE French Specification on the independent learning link on the LJS homepage. ALL of the vocabulary you need to access is on quizlet keep at it-little and often.
<b>Speaking exam W.C 27<sup>th</sup> April- 2<sup>nd</sup> week back after Easter.</b>	Role play- practice using the examples. Photo-cards- practice using the examples. Conversation- nominated topic plus another unknown theme. 5-7 mins Foundation. 7-9 minutes. The time will be split evenly between two topics. <b>MAKE SURE YOU ASK YOUR TEACHER A QUESTION and REVISE QUESTION WORDS.</b> Make a mock 1:1 appointment with your teacher between now and the Easter holidays. Tactics? Odds and evens Record it- listen to it- say it- repeat Get your teacher to record it-listen-say it-repeat. Use the first letter of each word on flashcards to support your learning process. Use look, cover write check whilst reading it out loud and writing it on a white board. Use the adobe spark video app to type it up and have it recorded. You can then listen and read it at the same time. See the flyer in your pack, "Smashing your speaking exam"
<b>Listening exam May 12<sup>th</sup> 2020</b>	All listening past papers are on the independent learning link with sound files, mark schemes and the transcripts. Do some little and often. BBC GCSE Bitesize has some very useful listening questions too which self-mark. Use the transcripts by highlighting/learning/creating a quizlet for unknown vocabulary. Keep re-visiting it and adding to it. Check you know your negatives. There is a very useful French teacher.net booklet with online videos and you can use pearsonactivelearn to complete class set tasks
<b>Reading exam May 12<sup>th</sup> 2020</b>	In your revision pack you have translations, gap fills, numerous past papers, (also online) positive and negative phrases and literary texts. Use these to drill different types of question. Use linguascope.com, language-gym and exampro for different types of questions. Again use the mark scheme to see where you went wrong and green pen note on your quizlet. Use activelearn to complete class set tasks set by your teacher and exercises in booklet on French teacher.net. There are also short, sharp questions per topic on A4 sheets from Pixel.
<b>Writing exam May 15<sup>th</sup> 2020</b>	You have past papers galore, writing strips, a writing booklet with many model questions to practice. Sentences, 40 and 90 word for foundation. 90 and 150 word plus translations for Higher. Do one regularly and submit to your teacher for marking and feedback. Use Scone and Toast and Croissant to enhance your writing. You have numerous model answers in your revision pack and a step by step guide as to how to access the top marks. Vocab crunch sheets are essential to get your verb accuracy right, do these daily to learn key vocabulary. Keep pensing and crois qu'ing and use your FRAJE verbs.
