Year Group Specific Messages

Year 7	<p>Year 7 student survey—Our school, along with several others, is participating in a local survey for young people. We have been asked by the Woodsmith Education Programme (part of Anglo American’s Crop Nutrients business based locally) to help collect information to inform their new personal development programme for young people. The Programme aims to support young people in our area to reach their potential, and has developed this survey with help from the local authority. Similar surveys in schools have been used in a variety of ways including:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. As a starting point for discussion in classroom activities 2. As a beginning for further enquiry to strengthen existing programmes 3. As a starting point for discussions between parents and schools <p>The questions concern a wide range of health behaviours, e.g. home and family relationships, emotional health and well-being, education and aspirations, and leisure and family life.</p> <p>The Woodsmith Programme, Local Authority and Public Health will gain a reliable database upon which it can objectively plan provision for young people.</p> <p>Both the Local Authority and the school find the content of the questionnaire acceptable; it has been customised to suit our local setting. Each questionnaire is anonymous and confidential, and no student will be identified when the data are returned to the school. The Local Authority will receive only the summary of all schools in which individual schools are not identified. Data Protection concerns are covered in the Privacy Notice for students (found at the end of this bulletin). The survey will be completed in school time, taking place before 20th January.</p> <p>Please contact school if you do not wish for your child to take part. We look forward to working with you in planning improved support for our students. We hold a copy of the questionnaire in the main office, and if you would like to view it, you are welcome to do so by appointment—please contact school if you do.</p>

Attendance Focus Period

Year 11 mock exams begin on Monday 23rd January and therefore we are currently within an **official attendance focus period** for all Year 11 students; it is vital they access all of their lessons in the lead up to these exams.

In order to ensure your child(ren) have the best possible opportunities to meet their potential, please ensure that they are in school every day so that they don't have any gaps in their learning.

Expectations of students are as follows:

- 2) Arrive to school **between 8am and 8:20am** to ensure they are in form on time and receive all key messages/participate in form time activities
- 3) Attend every lesson on time.

Privacy Notice – school surveys



1. Who are you?

We are a research unit in South-West England called SHEU.
Our website address is: www.sheu.org.uk

We have been asked by the Woodsmith Education Programme (part of Anglo American's Crop Nutrients business) to help collect information from young people. The Woodsmith Education Programme is a project which aims to support young people in your area reach their potential. The Programme has developed this survey with help from your Local Education Authority to ensure that we ask the most useful questions.

2. What will I be asked?

You will be asked about your habits and feelings, and other important things about you.

You will not be asked for your name or address, and please don't tell us!



3. Why do you want to know this?

The information young people give for this survey will help The Woodsmith Education Programme ensure that it is helping to support young people in the way it hopes to. Your school will also find the information helpful to make sure that they are providing all the support that young people need. Your Local Education Authority will find the information useful in their planning for the future.

4. How will you use my information?

The reports from the survey will be anonymous. This means that you will not be identified in any way, so you can answer honestly because your answers will not be connected to you.



We will send reports to the Woodsmith Education Programme; to the schools involved in the study, and to the Local Education Authorities of the North Yorkshire and of Redcar & Cleveland.

The reports will show how many pupils gave different answers. For example, the reports might say things like: "30% of pupils in this school had cereal for breakfast, but in the whole County the figure was 40%"



5. How will you collect this information?

Your answers will be kept safe on our computers. If you submit your answers on a paper survey, we will enter the information you give onto a computer and then destroy the paper copy. SHEU will keep the information for three years.

6. How do you keep this information?

Your answers will be kept safe on our computers. We will keep these records for three years



7. Are you allowed to do this? ('legal basis for processing')

The Woodsmith Education Programme is collecting this data to support pupils to reach their potential as part of its commitment to the communities in which Anglo American operates. This gives us what is known as a 'Legitimate Interest' to collect the information.

SHEU is allowed to use information to produce its reports as long as no-one can tell what answers you gave and that we treat the data carefully and safely.

8. Who gets to see the information?

Only limited staff from SHEU are allowed to see your answers. They won't show your answers to anyone else. Everyone else sees only percentages. No-one in your school sees your answers.



BUT, if you tell us something that makes us think you are in danger, we will have to tell your school that someone has said it, even if we can't find out who you are.



9. What's next?

If you agree with all this, please tick the box at the start of the survey. If not, don't take part.

You can leave out any questions you don't want to answer, and you can stop at any time.

Later, if you want to see what we know about you, you can ask us, and you can tell us to delete it. But we might not be able to find your answers because we don't know your name.
