


Gateway accounts—please ensure that your child's Gateway account is in credit if they get school lunches.

end. They where 2-0 up at half time with the game finishing 2-2. Annabelle Scored and Violet was awarded player of the match, well done to both of you!




Well done Year 11 Boys football team who beat Easington Academy 5-0 last Friday after school in the first round of the English Schools Cup.
