<u>Happy New Year!</u> We were pleased to have welcomed back students after the holidays—I hope you and your families had an enjoyable Christmas and New Year. As we approach this new term, I would like to draw your attention to the attendance update within this bulletin containing some key pieces of information about attendance including a change to the time morning registers close.

Attendance matters at Laurence Jackson!



Attendance at Laurence Jackson is a priority for staff and students. We endeavour to work with students in all aspects of school life. Attendance is a topic of daily conversations in form time and lessons. Rewards and intervention strategies are used here at Laurence Jackson to help students attend well. We have a dedicated attendance team to help and support you and your child. Please use attendanceteam@laurencejackson.org for all communication.

School expect children to be on site for 8.20 ready for line up/ in form rooms for 8.30 for a prompt start to the day. As of Monday 15th January, Morning registers now close at 9am. Meaning if student arrive after this time, without valid reason, they will not their morning mark and this will effect their attendance.

Being in school and having the best attendance possible underpins all the many benefits of school - not just children's learning but their wellbeing and wider development. But, for some children, attending school every day will be harder than for others. <u>GCSEs and Attendance:</u> On 2 November 2023 <u>the Children's Commissioner reported new data</u> suggesting that persistent absentees (attendance below 90%) in year 10 whose attendance improved in year 11 were much more likely to get 5 good GCSEs than those whose attendance didn't. 54% of pupils who were persistently absent in year 10 and then rarely absent in year 11 passed at least 5 GCSEs including English and maths, compared to 36% of pupils who were persistently absent in both years.

Please do keep Laurence Jackson in the know of any medical appointments, needs and updates as well as leave of absences. We understand medical appointments can fall within school times and we endeavour to work with families on leave of absences.

Leave of absence forms can be found at Reception. Please read below the leave of absence policy-

Any requests for leave during term time will be considered on an individual basis and the pupil's previous attendance record will be considered. Where the absence is granted, the headteacher will determine the length of time that the pupil can be away from school. The school is unlikely to grant leaves of absence for the purposes of family holidays.

Requests for leave will not be granted in the following circumstances:

- During Year 7 when a pupil is settling into the school, unless certain exceptional circumstances apply, e.g. the death of an immediate family member at any time in September
- If a holiday warning letter or Penalty Notice has been issued in the previous 12 calendar months, measured from the date before the first day of the leave of absence regardless of overall attendance during the previous 12-month period.
- Holidays taken during term time due to cost
- Holidays for the purpose of visiting a relative, unless where the person is critically ill
- During any formal assessment periods. This includes but is not limited to KS4 mock exam periods/formal examinations and preparation time prior to these taking place.
- For any more than 5 consecutive school days, even when some exceptional circumstances apply
- When more than one term-time holiday has been requested and takes place within one school year.

How can you help your child's attendance?

- Think is your child fit to learn? We all can feel tired and a bit poorly on a morning but is your child so unwell they need to be off school? Could they come into school will they start to feel better and pick up as the day goes on?
- Make sure they are on time. Get them up, set that alarm and off they go ready and on school site for 8.20.
- If your child is going to be off please **contact the school office by 8.30 on option 3**, the attendance line, and explain their symptoms.
- Keep us updated! If you child is going to off for more than one day then please ring each morning and update school on their symptoms.
- Medical appointment coming up? Let us know in advance and provide proof if possible please.

Guidance from the government on illness and anxiety-

It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. we are aware that more children may be absent from school due to symptoms of anxiety than before the pandemic. Worry and mild or moderate anxiety, whilst sometimes difficult emotions, can be a normal part of growing up for many children and young people. Being in school can often help alleviate the underlying issues. A prolonged period of absence is likely to heighten a child's anxiety about attending in the future, rather than reduce it.
